

Four RBI Day For Lucas Stancic Seals the Deal In New South Wales 'S Victory Over South Australia

Lucas Stancic came to the ballpark and meant business on Friday, driving in four on three hits to lead New South Wales past South Australia 8-3 on Friday. Stancic drove in runs on a home run in the fourth and a single in the fifth.

South Australia scored three runs in the fourth inning, but New South Wales still managed to pull out the victory. Aiden Lucas, Zachary Altamura, and Alistar Tanner all moved runners across the plate with RBIs in the inning.

New South Wales got on the board in the second inning when Darcy Williams singled on a 1-1 count, scoring two runs.

New South Wales pulled away for good with two runs in the fourth inning. In the fourth Stancic homered on the first pitch of the at-bat, scoring two runs. New South Wales put up three runs in the fifth inning. The rally was led by singles by Liam Grant and Stancic.

Daniel Mills was the winning pitcher for New South Wales. The pitcher allowed three hits and three runs over five and a third innings, striking out three. Ben Karakasis threw one and two-thirds innings in relief out of the bullpen.

Wil Couzner took the loss for South Australia. Couzner lasted three innings, allowing eight hits and four runs while striking out four and walking zero.

New South Wales smacked two home runs on the day. Josh Nati put one out in the sixth inning. Stancic had a long ball in the fourth inning.

New South Wales tallied 11 hits in the game. Stancic and Williams each racked up multiple hits for New South Wales. Stancic went 3-for-3 at the plate to lead New South Wales in hits.
