#### Starting your season right

This month, we turned to three-time ABL Manager of the Year and BlueSox Head Coach, Tony Harris, to discuss this month's 'Coaches Corner" topic; Starting your season right.

As we're just starting to get into the swing of things this season and the first rounds of Baseball have begun, we asked Tony what 3 tips can he offer to start your

season off right and really get yourself on the front foot to set up for a good season. He had some really great insight to offer:

#### **Confidence and Preparation:**

Firstly 'player confidence' to me is vitally important at any level of our great game. And confidence comes from knowing you have done the preparation and work towards the task (in this case the season or start of the season).

## Coaches Corner cont. Starting your season right

Heading into the first month of the season, it's important to have confidence in your ability and reassure your own self you have done the work to compete at the level you're playing at.

If you simply haven't done the necessary work and taken the reps needed it will not only affect your standard of play but also your mindset.

It's not too late. If you have missed a few sessions due to rain, work, sickness, or interest level, then get to work and get those reps in, you will be amazed how much doing the prep work (as late as this week) has on your confidence level and in turn on your overall performance.

#### **Recovery:**

You are going to feel a bit sore, from your first actual competitive games. Ensure you have considered your recovery process. It doesn't matter if you're playing A grade state league or masters, you will need to recover from game activity. Nutrition and Exercise, stretch pre and post-game and workouts, and hydration is crucial, the right meals post-game, not just a cold beer at the social level, but also the right balance of protein, fats and carbs to allow your muscles to recover and rebuild towards the following week's workouts and game activity. For some just being on your feet for 3 hrs will be enough to take its toll, to others catching 9 innings will have a different effect. As we all are different, be aware of what you need, have an understanding of your body's needs and self-aware of how to recover and prepare for your next game.



#### Have fun, be a GREAT team-mate:

As they say in the movies, "this game is about fun right". Ensure you're having fun with your mates. Now it's game time, be aware of picking up a buddy if they have made an error that cost a run, struck out at a crucial time in the game or just struggled to get up the line in some cases at a social level. Have some empathy and appreciate what they are trying to achieve in the game, and pick them up if need be, be a good teammate.

Lead by example, inspire and empower others with your actions not just your words. And above all have fun out there.


#### **Blacktown Workers Baseball**





## High 5 for the Big 5 Initiative

The Concussion Big 5 is a new initiative of Macquarie University and the Australian Chronic Traumatic Encephalopathy (CTE) Biobank, in partnership with Sydney FC to keep the community safe in sport by better detecting concussion.

Dr Rowena Mobbs, Macquarie University neurologist and Director of the Australian CTE Biobank, is encouraging everyone attending community sporting matches to make themselves aware of the five key signs of concussion: Slump, Sway, Slow, Stun and Slur.

This new initiative is designed to normalise concussion detection, educating parents, kids, referees, coaches and commentators watching the sport about the major signs to look for.

#### **Know the Concussion Big 5:**

**Slump:** lying motionless, unconscious or knocked out

**Sway:** appearing wobbly, unsteady or falling over

**Slow:** walking slowly, wandering or delayed movements

**Stun:** appearing confused or stunned or behaving unusually

**Slur:** slurred or slow speech, or responding poorly
