

Coaches orner

Welcome to Coaches Corner. Here where we will feature notable coaches within the Baseball NSW network.

In the modern game, technological advancements are aiding coaches in player development across the globe. At Baseball NSW, we're dedicated to the goal of ensuring the best possible resources are provided to grow our players. Our coaching team gave us a bit of insight this month into the technology we use and how it develops excellence.

Technology at Baseball NSW:

Here at Baseball NSW, we strongly believe in using technology to help us to develop the future baseball stars of New South Wales. Specifically, the two devices we use the most are Rapsodo for both pitching and hitting and Blast Motion for an extended look into hitting metrics.



Coaches Corner cont. Preparing for Major Tournaments

At a glance, baseball technologies can be a lot to take in, especially for young athletes and parents who may be diving into it for the first time. It is important to remember that devices like the ones we use will churn out a plethora of data and these analytics help us understand how to best develop the individual player and refine their craft.

Data such as spin rate and velocity for pitchers are usually the first thing to grab the attention of players and parents. However, in terms of adjusting, these numbers alone won't give you an indication of what to work on. Data like spin direction and horizontal and vertical release points are things that you can use to compare and see the improvements that your players are making and in turn, we can see how these correlate to significant data like velocity or spin rate.

Hitting metrics can fall into a similar trap as pitching metrics with data like exit velocity and distance being the big numbers. When you look further into supplementary data like attack angle, plane scores and bat speed or path, this helps develop and adjust the swing to create better numbers in that exit velocity and distance, hopefully resulting in greater metrics.

In our development programs, these technologies help us collate data on players that helps us as coaches direct, build and mould an athlete so they can reach their fullest potential either on the mound or at bat. Without them, this can still be achieved, but at what rate? These metrics are crucial to being able to pinpoint certain elements of a player's craft that require development.

Is technology a Coaches friend or foe?


In the game of baseball today there is a huge push for analytics to help create future stars and there is a growing importance for these metrics to be used. Whilst this is great, we must all remember that the data is there to accompany and assist the coaches who are experienced in adjusting and making small changes in our athletes to create better outcomes for them. The data alone is not the solution, but the data in the hands of capable coaches will create a more well-rounded player who will develop and grow through time and commitment.



Baseball NSW are lucky to partner with amazing companies such as Rapsodo, and Blast Motion to give our athletes and our coaches access to these metrics and we are excited to continue to develop ball players within our great state and help them along their baseball journey.

Special thanks went out to Pieta, Fiona, Wendy, Boz, Chris, Brooke and Adrian. These days couldn't happen without their time and efforts!!






Club Corner cont. Longstanding Member, Noel Palmer, Retires

At the start of this month, The Pacific Coast Baseball League (PCBL) held a presentation day to recognise longstanding member Noel Palmer and his contribution to the sport of Baseball, at Oakleigh Park, Thornleigh.

Noel announced his retirement this season, after 66 years of participation and service to our great game. The following is the story of Noel and his love for the sport)

Noel Geoffrey Palmer:

Noel was born on the 6th of December 1948 in Glenelg, South Australia, moving to Sydney via Melbourne. At the age of seven in 1956, residing on Sydney's north shore, Noel found baseball - joining the Lane Cove District Baseball Club. Worth noting, this club was one of the eight



founding member clubs of the then NSW Metropolitan Baseball Association, currently the Sydney Winter Baseball, League, which started in 1898.


Noel progressed his baseball life, being selected in the junior local area

representative teams for the under 12s, 14s and 16s. He participated in the NSW State Junior Championships and later joined the senior baseball playing ranks.

Noel's coaching career began when he was in his early 20s mostly at the Lane Cove Baseball Club, but also coaching the Hunters Hill High School team winning the NSW school's 'Proud Shield' premiership, taking the team to an unparalleled record with 106 runs for and none against. Noel coached the Under 16's at his club in the years between 1968 and 1974, taking his team to several championships. He then took on the role of Manager for the NSW Under 16 side at two Junior Australian Championships. Noel also was the head coach at Lane Cove between 1968 and 1988, coaching the grade teams for more than 20 years.

Another huge role Noel played was in the baseball administrative side, elected to the Lane Cove Baseball Club management committee as the junior representative, later holding the positions of president, secretary and treasurer, roles that he carried out for over 20 years. Noel also held roles as a community representative at the Lane Cove Council, responsible for



the areas of sporting operations and other alike activities in the community. Noel later joined the Sydney Winter Baseball League committee, responsible for media liaison, and attending to the publishing of the league's weekend results in the press.

Finally, Noel moved his baseball interests into umpiring in the mid-1980s, joining as an umpire for the recently formed Pacific Coast Baseball League (PCBL) in 1985, and later in 1990 became a member of the NSW Baseball Umpires Association. He became the president of the PCBL Baseball Umpires Association, a role he carried out for seven years, and later president of the Sydney Baseball

Umpires Association, for another five years. His duties included umpire development, training and co-ordinator on the umpire appointments for all weekend games. In 2009, Noel umpired at the World Masters Baseball games, held in Sydney officiating in the Grand Final, and then again in Auckland in 2017. Noel became a huge contributor for umpire duties to the Sydney-based NSW Major League Baseball, now known as the NSW State League, the Sydney Winter Baseball League (previously the NSW Baseball League) and the Pacific Coast Baseball League.

Noel's interests extended to country baseball championships around NSW, travelling as the principal umpire with the Willoughby Baseball Club, and now the Sydney Deadstars Baseball Club. Supporting the Sydney Deadstars since 1985. Noel and other club members hold the record of attending NSW Country Championships for nearly 30 consecutive years (1994-2022), with over 46 baseball tours.

In 2021, Noel was honoured as a Life Member by the Tamworth Baseball Umpires Association, and in 2022,



Noel was awarded as a Life Member by the Pacific Coast Baseball League.

There must be thousands of people in the baseball community that know Noel, as he has always left an indelible mark due to his dedication, professionalism and care in all areas of baseball and knowing people.

Baseball NSW and the entire Sydney University Baseball community are mourning the loss of Kendal Binns.

A long-time member of our New South Wales baseball community and a former player who was part of the victorious NSW team who took out the Claxton Shield competition in 1951, undefeated.

A player with an outstanding history, Kendal was a double Sydney University Blue for baseball (1942 and 1943) and a Blue for Cricket. Athletes are awarded a Blue as a student competing in the highest level of a sporting competition, for achieving outstanding sporting excellence in a 12-month period. He was selected as a member of the best ever University Baseball team covering the 1941-1970 era. This would have been no mean feat given that baseball was a winter sport in those days, and that many top cricketers also played the game in their off season.



Kendal passed away at the ripe age of 99, just three months shy of his milestone 100th birthday. He was always proud of the 1951 team's effort and his trophy always held a special place in his home, standing proudly in his lounge room.

Our condolences to Kendal's family and friends, and may he rest in peace.

The 2022/23 Season for the New South Wales State and Women's league is tracking well, as teams have come head-to-head each week to compete for the top spot in our most competitive leagues.



Team Australia U18's World Cup Qualifiers

Recently, Team Australia selected the roster for the Under 18's World Cup Qualifiers which just took place in Auckland, New Zealand.

From the 12th to the 14th of December, seven NSW players took part in the tournament to determine whether they go to the WBSC U18 World Cup late next year.

Day one saw Team Australia win 10-0 against Guam in 5 innings. Adam Bates struck out all 9 he faced in 3 innings and Josh Nati's bat was on fire, going 2 for 3 with 2 RBIs. The Australian pitchers combined on a 13-strikeout no-hitter.

On the second day, Team Australia was defeated 10-6 in the first game of the day against the hosts, New Zealand. In Game 3, Australia defeated Guam 11-0 in 6 innings. Our own Liam Grant hit a homer in this crucial win.

A comeback performance was given on day three by Australia defeating New Zealand 10-0.



Adam Bates went 4 innings giving up only 1 hit along with 6 strikeouts. Blake Gooding had 2 hits and an RBI amidst some great offensive efforts across the team to push them ahead.

They played the Gold Medal match against New Zealand on the final day and won. Australia successfully qualified for the World Cup with the 4-0 victory over New Zealand! Josh Nati once again had a great batting performance and was 1 for 2 with 2 RBIs in the final match.

Congratulations Team Australia, and we cannot wait to watch them compete on the world stage next year!

NSW Women's Opens and Youth State Teams Trial Information

Baseball NSW are calling upon players wishing to trial for the NSW Opens or Youth Women's State Teams.

The teams will compete in the Australian Women's Championships scheduled for April 7 – 13, 2023 at a venue yet to be decided by Baseball Australia.

To be eligible to trial for the Women's Opens team, and be eligible for selection, players must be 15 years of age before the commencement of the tournament.

To be eligible for the Women's Youth Team selection, players must be at least 12 years of age before the commencement of the tournament but not have turned 16 years of age as of 31st December of the preceding year.

Baseball NSW has introduced Baseball5 to the school programs.

Baseball5 is a fast-paced, dynamic and inclusive game that can be played anywhere, anytime. All you need is a ball, some training equipment such as agility ladders, markers and throw down bases.

Instructor development programs are available to both Primary and High schools, also to Universities, Recreational Centres and Baseball Associations.

Baseball NSW is a member and contributor of the Federal Governments Sporting Schools program. The program coordinates sporting organisations, coaches, and teachers to deliver sport before, during and after school hours. Schools can apply for <u>funding</u> to deliver a program each term and is available to both primary and high schools. Parents and guardians are also able to use the \$100 <u>Active Kids Voucher</u> towards enrolling their kids in the Baseball5 program.

Furthermore, <u>Sporting Schools Club</u> <u>Connect</u> will enable eligible primary schools to build on their involvement in the Sporting Schools program by establishing and building upon relationships with local sporting clubs.



CLAIM TWO \$100 ACTIVE KIDS VOUCHERS

All NSW school-enrolled children are eligible for **two \$100 Active Kids vouchers** each year. The vouchers can be used with any approved Active Kids provider, to help cover costs towards registration or membership fees for sport and active recreation. **Voucher one is valid January to December** and **voucher two is valid July to December**. After 1 July 2020, the second voucher can be claimed immediately after the first voucher.


