I also represented NSW Under 16's and Under 18's.

I've now completed two years at Junior College at McCook, Nebraska and he have just committed to Wayland Baptist University in Texas for the next two upcoming American school years.

Amy: I've played two years at Baulkham Hills but unfortunately played limited games both seasons due to injuries sustained playing other sports. I've also represented NSW playing in the 2022 Barclay Cup where we were national runners-up. I've now been selected again to represent NSW in this year's Barclay Cup which will take place in Perth in October.

What is the biggest baseball highlight/ achievement for each of you?

Riley: Being given the opportunity to play college baseball at McCook Junior College in Nebraska.

Amy: Being selected to represent NSW in the Under 16's Barclay Cup tournament at the age of 12.

Riley: My current role model is UFC Fighter Alexander Volkanovski. I admire his mental toughness, grit and determination.

Amy: My role model is the netball player Jo Harten. Even though she sustained a serious injury, she showed resilience and continues to support and encourage her teams (internationally and nationally.)

It was great to hear from Riley and Amy as they continue to grow and succeed in this sport. Both are achieving great things not only here in Australia but in America as well. Riley was selected in and played in a Region 9 All-Star game and in 2022 Riley was named in the 2nd All-American Academic team for Junior College. Amy continues to follow in her older brother's

footsteps, yet forge her own path, making waves in representative women's baseball at such a young age. Keep an eye out for both of these names as Riley heads to Wayland Baptist University in Texas and Amy returns for another crack at the 2023 Barclay Cup in Perth. Baseball NSW wishes to announce the finalised capitation fees for the 2023/24 baseball season!

On Monday 3rd July 2023, all Baseball NSW clubs were informed of the capitation fees for the upcoming season.

There has been no increase in the Baseball NSW 2022/23 Capitation Fees. Baseball NSW has had to make a minor adjustment to the total cost of the processing fees, which are minimal.

Baseball Australia has increased their fees by \$3.00 per member type for this financial year.

Baseball NSW encourages everyone to take advantage of the NSW Office of Sport Active Kids Vouchers of which NSW residents aged between 41/2 and 18 are eligible.

Active Kids Vouchers Announcement

A recent announcement was made by the NSW Office of Sport, regarding the future of the Active Kids and First Lap voucher programs.

All NSW Sports have been informed children enrolled in school will be eligible for a new \$50 Active Kids voucher from 1 July. The new Active Kids voucher will be valid until 31 January 2024.

On 1 February 2024, a new means-tested Active and Creative Kids voucher program will be launched for children enrolled in school. The voucher will be for \$50 and will be issued twice a year, at the start of terms 1 and 3. The new program will cover activities currently available under both the Active and Creative Kids voucher programs.

The Office of Sport, Create NSW and Service NSW are working closely together to develop the business and operational model for the new program and we will continue to keep us updated regularly.



In the immediate term, the Office of Sport voucher and communications teams will be focusing on encouraging the redemption of the \$100 Active Kids and First Lap vouchers before they expire on 30 June this year.
