

Another Successful Year of High Performance:

Baseball NSW prides itself in player development, with key programs run throughout the year to ensure our state players are equipped to be amongst the top in the country. With development programs across both genders and in both metro and country regions, the selected players have access to top coaches and high-performance programs

over the winter (off) season. We have now concluded the Winter High-Performance Programs.

The Performance (U18's) and Developing (U16's) Pathway Programs, the Emerging Pathway Program (U12-14's) and the Women's Development Program (Opens) were run by our State Development Team of Grahame Cassel and Coen Wynne, in collaboration with an array of experienced coaches.

PPP/DPP

This year, 32 players were selected in the PPP and DPP programs. These players were judged the best U18's and U16's talent that turned up to trial. They went through a 10-week program, with the U18's training three times a week and U16's twice a week. There were games thrown in as well, to develop the players in game situations.

They had instruction in throwing, hitting, fielding, base running, pitching, strength & conditioning and game awareness. We have worked hard with these players to refine their craft over the winter so they can put these skills to use this coming summer.

EPP

Our youngest winter program was once again run over three venues. Run by State Development Officer, Coen Wynne, this program that caters for U12s-U14s sees an array of position and skill-specific work being done, helping them prepare for their future in progressing into state-based programs.

"Thank you to the three clubs that played host to us again this year and the many coaches who put in multiple hours to help our players lock down the basics and hone their skills through our 8-week program."



WDP

This year saw a new layout of our Women's Development program with distinguished 'Futures' and 'Elite' groups working on a more skill-level focused program. With a large influx of participants, Coen believes "it was great to give these players a platform to continue their growth in the game, learning new skills and sharpen existing skills along the way." Developing Women's Baseball has been a focus for Baseball NSW, with many exciting opportunities such as the Barclay Cup and our partnership with Fukuoka, Japan, coming to fruition in the last couple of years.

Finally, a huge thank you to all the coaches who assisted in this year's high-performance programs! We could not have run these programs without your dedication and assistance.

NSW Stars feature at U18's World Cup 2023

The WBSC Under 18's World Cup was played this month, with seven NSW players in the squad.

Our boys lit up the international stage alongside their teammates, and finished up in the Placement Round of this prestigious event, with four going on to be named in the MLB World Select team and Adam Bates (Macarthur Orioles) officially signing with the Boston Red Sox!

Whilst not achieving their desired outcomes, this young squad gave it their all at the World Cup! With a few returning for their second crack, multiple players were debuting at this tournament. The team showed great resilience ending their U18 World Cup campaign with a win over the World #6 ranked team, Venezuela.

Read all the NSW player highlights here:

ADAM BATES

Adam was back for his second U18 World Cup, leading the pitching staff. He was the Game One starter against Chinese Taipei, going toe-to-toe with his opposition Yi-Lei Sun, who was regarded as one of the top prospects at this event. He also had great

outings against Korea and Venezuela.
Bates finished the tournament with a
3.00 ERA while striking out 7 in 7 innings
pitched. He signed a professional contract
with the Boston Red Sox while at the U18
World Cup.

KOBY CHESTERTON

Koby had a 2.10 ERA out of the bullpen in games against Mexico and the Czech Republic. He was a strong pitching addition to the team, with his stand out performance being when he closed out Team Australia's win against Mexico in a close 4-2 game.

JOSH NATI

Josh never ceases to amaze us. He entered the competition as one of the youngest players in the world to play at the U18 World Cup. He was the designated hitter for most of the tournament and also caught a game. He hit in the middle of the line-up every day finishing with a .300 batting average.

BEN KARAKASIS

Ben, a first year player who was a key bullpen piece, pitched in three games at his debut tournament. He came into Game One against Chinese Taipei with multiple runners on base and none out

and managed to get 3 outs in 4 pitches without allowing a run. He also did not give up a run against Chinese Taipei or Panama. What an effort from the first timer which was rewarded with his selection in the MLB World Select Team for 2023.

DANIEL MILLS

Another first-year U18 pitcher, Millsy who after a rough start against the Czech Republic was able to bounce back really well and close out the win against Venezuela on the last day of the tournament. That game really highlighted the resilience of these players and they finished on a high!

JACOB PALMER

Palmer was used out of the bullpen against Puerto Rico and the Czech Republic, two big games where, unfortunately, the opposition pulled away and Australia just couldn't hold on. As a first-year U18 player he still went out there and held his own, striking out 3 hitters in 2.2 innings and finished the tournament with a 2.63 ERA.

LACHLAN ROSSER

NSW Country representative, Rosser, had the most appearances by an Australian pitcher at the tournament throwing across four different games out of the bullpen. He finished with a 3.82 ERA after pitching against Chinese Taipei, Korea, Panama and Venezuela. He only gave up earned runs in 1 of his 4 outings.

CALLUM DONNELLY

Callum, another NSW Country boy (Illawarra), played centre field and hit leadoff in almost every game! He led the team in walks with five showing a great eye at the plate compared to only two strikeouts all tournament. Andrew Riddell from Baseball Australia commented "the stats don't show everything as he put the ball in play almost every at-bat and also hit a lot of balls hard, but right at fielders." Donnelley played great defence in the outfield and did not make an error all tournament.

Congratulations to all our NSW players on their efforts at this World Cup!! It is a huge achievement to represent your country and these are memories that last a lifetime.














Adam Bates Signs Professional Deal With Boston Red Sox

Congratulations to Adam Bates who has been signed by the Boston Red Sox MLB organisation!

Bates joins the growing list of NSW players that are playing professionally overseas. At just 18 years old, Adam continues to impress across the board. At the Under 18's World Cup just passed,

Adam posted a 3.00 ERA in three appearances and opened the tournament for Team Australia going toe-to-toe with one of the highest-regarded pitchers in the competition, Yi-Lei Sun. Bates has also been an impressive player in our local NSW State League competition, playing First Grade for the Macarthur Orioles who finished runners-up in the 2022/23 Season. He was also a Sydney Blue Sox development player in the ABL.

Adam boasts an impressive resume for such a young player, and when asked how he feels taking those next steps towards his dream of playing professionally, his response was "I feel much more at ease and happy with my decision. It feels like a dream come true, and to be able to call myself a professional is the best feeling I've ever had."

Baseball Australia reported that the "Red Sox have kept a close eye on the development of Bates and other Australian prospects. They visited Adam at the Under-18 National Camp on the Gold Coast in August, [and] that's when negotiations really started to heat up." Bates has been on the Red Sox radar for multiple years and the conversations sparked early on about the option of professional baseball or going to college.

With many eyes on Adam, we asked what goes through the mind when faced with being scouted on such a big stage, such as the Under 18's World Cup, just passed. "Performing in front of scouts is always a tiny bit stressful, seeing radars and video cameras on you, but knowing I had already signed (or agreed to sign) I just wanted to show them why I did and honestly why they should've signed me earlier."

As a young athlete who has taken every opportunity given to him, Bates has been through multiple NSW development

pathways and sought advice from the baseball community that continues to support him. His advice that he now passes along is to "never say never to your dreams. If you want it, then go out and get it. Even if it means making sacrifices... this is what puts you ahead."

Finally, "Don't let anybody tell you what you can and can't do it's your life, not theirs"

Australia's participation in this event is a great opportunity to promote the growth of Baseball5 across the country. This team will be the first Australian side to partake in a WBSC Baseball5 World Cup since its inception, which has created a unique pathway for our athletes into future World Cup and Youth Olympic teams.

The Youth Baseball5 World Cup will be held next month in Ankara, Turkey from the 10th to the 15th of October. Australia will be in Group B, with their first game scheduled for October 11th against Ghana.

With a solid foundation of coaches across the board, we are hopeful for another successful year at the upcoming 2024 Nationals.






We are once again entering a new season of the State and Women's League, and we couldn't be more excited!
