Glenn Williams – Player – Era 2000+.

- ❑ In 1993, as a 16-year-old, Glenn signed a lucrative free agent contract with the Atlanta Braves for an estimated 1.3 million Australian dollars.
- ❑ He played baseball for the Minor League affiliates of the Atlanta Braves, Toronto Blue Jays, and Minnesota Twins. After spending over 10 years in the Minor Leagues, Glenn made his Major League debut with the Minnesota Twins during the 2005 season.
- ❑ In 2007 Glenn played for the Minnesota Twins Triple-A affiliate team, the 'Rochester Red Wings'. After a 13-game career hitting streak, Glenn then retired from the Minnesota Twins organization.
- ❑ He was a member of the Australian National Team that won the Silver Medal at the 2004 Summer Olympics in Athens, Greece.
- ❑ In August 2010, Glenn was appointed as Manager of the Australian Baseball League Foundation Club, Sydney Bluesox, in their inaugural 2010/11 season.
- ❑ In April 2021, Baseball Australia announced Glenn as the new Chief Executive Officer.
- ❑ Inducted into the 2013 Bankstown Municipality Sporting Hall of Fame.
- ❑ Inducted into the Baseball Australia Hall of Fame as a Player in 2012 for the Era 2000+.
- ❑ Inducted into the Baseball NSW Hall of Fame 2025.
