



Chris Oxspring – Player – Era 2000 - 2009.

- ❑ Chris Oxspring is an Australian professional baseball pitcher who has played Major League Baseball, Nippon Professional Baseball, KBO League and has also played and coached in the Australian Baseball League (ABL) for the Sydney Bluesox.
- ❑ Chris was a star for Australia in the 2004 Olympics, pitching 2 wins, both against Japan – the Silver Medal.
- ❑ Chris's professional debut was for the San Diego Padres in Sept 2005.
- ❑ Chris joined Hanshin Tigers in Nippon Professional Baseball (NPB) for the 2006 season. December 2006 Chris signed a Minor League contract with the Milwaukee Brewers, and in July 2007 his contract was sold to the LG Twins of the Korea baseball organisation just one day before serving as the Pacific Coast Leagues starting pitcher in the 2007 Triple A All-Star game.
- ❑ December 2010, while playing with the Sydney Bluesox, Chris signed a minor league deal with an invitation to spring training with the Detroit Tigers. At the end of the 2010 - 2011 ABL season, Chris led the league in innings pitched (68.2), games started (11) and strikeouts (71). In June 2011 Detroit released Chris from AAA, shortly after he signed with independent team the Somerset Patriots for the remainder of 2011.
- ❑ 2013 and 2014 Chris played with the Lotte Giants of the KBO League and in 2015 he played with the KTWiz.
- ❑ 2016 to 2018 Chris served as a pitching coach for the Lotte Giants.
- ❑ 2022/2023 Chris returned to the Bluesox at 45 years of age and became the oldest Australian born player to play in the league's history. At 46-years of age Chris returned for the last regular season game of the 2022 - 2023.
- ❑ Inducted into the Baseball NSW Hall of Fame 2025.
